

**Dresden Plate Quilt**  
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Supply list

This quilt is made up of blocks that have nine segments which are 40-degree wedges sewn together to make the plate. The plate that is formed is then machine appliquéd to the background and then center circle or hexagon is appliquéd on top. The blocks are 12" square and are divided by 2" sashings. The blocks may be set straight or on-point to create varying looks. The quilt may be done by piecing two to nine different fabrics for the wedges or by using 9 repeats of a print fabric in the "stack and whack" style. **You can do either fabric selection with either block setting.** Yardage is given for several size quilts, straight or on-point settings, and either nine fabrics or stack and whack wedges. The blocks are 12" square, the sashings are 2" x 12 and the cornerstones are 2" square (all finished size measurements). I've assumed 6" borders for sizes and yardage - 1" first border and 5" second border. Yours may vary. **Call me with any questions.**

(1) If you want to use fewer than nine fabrics, multiply 9 time yardage in this column, then divide by the number of fabrics desired -- purchase that much of each.

**Yardage -- Nine repeats of the same fabric selection for plates (using "stack and whack" technique)**

- In addition, purchase background, strip dividers, sashing, cornerstones, first and second border fabrics as listed above. If you are doing the on-point version, also purchase side and corner triangle yardage.

**Additional supplies need for class:**

Sewing machine, neutral thread and thread to match your "plate" fabric, filled bobbins, 1/4" foot for your machine and appliquéd foot, if available. Instead of thread to match plates, you may use monofilament thread for appliquéd.

Regular sewing notions - pins, scissors, ripper, etc.

Rotary Cutter and Rotary ruler(s) - 6" x 24", 6" x 12", and 12-1/2" square rulers, if you have them

Rotary cutting mat, large enough to accommodate 24" ruler
